Hola hermanos,

We hope that you all had a great Christmas and New Year celebration.

While 2021 was an improvement over 2020 it wasn't without its special challenges for all of us. The good news, rather great news, is that God is on His throne and in control of every part of our lives. Ministry is always full of challenges, but we have the awesome opportunity to see God move through it all.

We thought we'd give you a brief update on our own families. As you surely know, Eli, our youngest son and his wife, Lulu, are serving with Broken Hearts, taking on more and more responsibility for the day to day working of the ministry. Our oldest son, Erich, still works for Exxon Mobile. He and his wife Michelle and their 3 kids were living in Papua New Guinea but have recently been reassigned to the Exxon headquarters in North Houston and are now living there. We had the blessing of having all of them, including Eli's 2 kids at our U.S. residence in New Mexico for Christmas. We praise God



for good health and blessed lives for all of us. Peggy's mother had to been moved to a full nursing home facility in recent months and is weakening. She's almost 90 years old. Thank you for your prayers for all of us.

2021 brought three great short-term groups, two of which came from the same church. They helped us bless a few families with much needed construction projects and we were able to do some upgrading on our own facilities. Two of the groups were mostly teenage youth and were able to have some great times with our own youth group. We had the



opportunity and blessing to host a young woman, Abby, for six weeks this summer. She has a heart for missions and is pursuing God's will for her. We also received designated financial support which enabled us to complete a few major projects on our own house and dorm. These are a big deal. This fall we had a "not so fun" project to deal with. The city sewer system plugged up and flooded the property behind our house. The liquid seeped in and flooded the dorm and Eli and Lulu's bedroom leaving them unusable. We've since built a solid wall in back

and installed a sump pump system for redundancy and have been able to use the dorm for visitors again. Without

prayerful support, both financial and physical, we wouldn't be able to do these projects.

With the help of several churches and individuals we were able do our annual Christmas gift box for 125 families. This event gives us the opportunity to bless the families within our ministry community and to meet new families in the area. We also received an incredible donation of Tupperware items from an awesome friend and supporter which were gifted to over 60 ladies who attended the Christmas ladies' events. They were so blessed!



As we are into our 22nd year of ministry we thank God for all He has done and will continue to do. Our staff has grown to nine people; six women and three men. We represent three different local churches. One church, Gracia Soberana, (Sovereign Grace), is a large, well-staffed and resourced work which offers many opportunities to learn through classes, and conferences for almost every aspect of ministry. Over the last several years the staff has been growing spiritually and in their understanding of how to reach into the community on a very personal level. The area in which we focus our work is called the colonia Juanita Luna. It is literally expanding daily to our north and south. We are making plans for how to make connections in these new neighborhoods. There is a great need for helps ministry and the majority of the people are unchurched. Pray for us to answer the call to reach our new neighbors with the hope of Christ. Luke 10:2 says..." The harvest is abundant, but the workers are few." This speaks to the need for our staff to be committed, prepared and resourced to be an effective team.

The daily, on-going work of Broken Hearts Ministries includes, but is not limited to:

- Evangelism through building relationships,
- Excellent, well planned, separate Bible studies for women, children, youth, and men.
- Weekly youth group gathering/Bible study for junior high and high school students.
 - A College group is being planned.
- Small, personal discipleship groups.
- Student scholarship/sponsor program for Junior High, High School, and College.
- A wide variety of helps or mercy ministries including construction, home visits and cleaning for those unable to care for themselves, financial help for emergencies like unexpected medical bills or unemployment.
- We maintain a food pantry used for extraordinary needs, which is all too common.

• We often aid with the numerous funerals, including funds, food for visiting family, tables and chairs, transportation in our van, etc.

Certainly, there are an endless number of responsibilities for the logistics and administration of the organization. Some of these still fall on Jim and Peg, but each of the staff does their part. They account for any ministry expenses they may have, organize receipts and see they are passed on to Eli and Lulu each week. They then put them in order and see that Janet and her husband Mike in El Paso receive them and can do the bookkeeping. (They're amazing.)

Believe it or not, all this is done by nine full time staff with a monthly salary expense of under \$7000. Yes, that's for all nine people. The total ministry expense is of course much more than that. Much of the other work is funded through designated giving. This may come by way of student support or designations for specific projects or people. We are so grateful for the awesome response we have always received for these special needs.

But, back to the salaries. The salaries are an expense of the general fund which also covers every other admin expense such as general vehicle and building maintenance, utilities, taxes, etc.

The last two years of fear and crisis have certainly taken a toll on many families' personal finances plus with inflation out of control we expected to see a reduction in the regular on-going general support for BHM. Jim and Peg both now receive their SS and have reduced their salary accordingly, but still each month we've been about \$2000 short in the general fund. This has caused our available funds in the bank to quickly be depleted.

God has been faithful through His faithful ones to sustain us during this time. We pray for all our supporters that God would abundantly provide for you and give you hearts for supporting His mission throughout the world.

Please see that the leaders of your church receive this newsletter. If your church is not yet a regular supporter of Broken Hearts Ministries perhaps you could be an advocate for us and encourage the church to invite us to visit in order to share in more detail what God is doing in our part of the world.

They have been going through a very hard time in their lives, and they have no-one to counsel them. Not even friends with whom to get together. We had a great time with them.
